Hicks asked each of us to choose an age-level color-coded sheet of instructions for the exercise period and to got to one of the many tables for ten so that each table had a wide range of ages. My age group was purple--the oldest. I found a table with nine persons, with whom I soon became acquainted by working through the two distinctly different exercises. Not all groups had the same set of exercises. In my group's first exercise, we had to choose a role to play from a list of six or seven different roles or "modes of interaction" before we tackled our paper cup, string, and rubber band exercise of stacking three cups. While I chose the role of "wanting to agree on the entire task before making a plan of attack," others chose to "get it done quickly", "have fun without focusing on task" or "waiting to see what others wanted to do". Trying to work on a task when eight others were acting out their varied roles made for chaos and frustration (for me). The next exercise was more peaceful and rewarding for each of us-writing our own "6-word novel," taking turns reading them aloud and getting feedback and offering others the same. As I sat quietly for the 15 minute writing period, contemplating my own novel, I saw my life rise before me and form into a pattern of six terse words. After my first "novel", I had time and insight to write a few more before time to

share. I was surprised that I could pour forth so much insight about my life--more than I recall coming up with in any sermon. I was eager to share what I had come up with and I was at least as eager to hear what others wrote. Sharing these with each other in our 9-person group was great fun—both in the giving and getting of feedback. Answering others' questions was fun and helpful, reminding me to return the favors to each of them when their turns came. We built a small community in such a short time because we learned and shared things about ourselves and responded to each other. Why can't worship services incorporate some of this level of growth experience? I'm not sure how to carry all this back to my congregation. Can I convey the joy this brought me to folks back home? I can try, but the value is in the doing, not so much in the telling. Finally, after our two exercises were ended, Dr. Hicks asked for audience response to his question of how it felt to be in a multigenerational group. After a few others spoke, I rose to speak as one in the oldest age category, saying that I was probably less aware of the age differences among us than were the younger ones. All seemed to be my peers because I've been at all of their age levels and relate easily to them. But younger members appeared more deferential to us oldsters, perhaps

In the first, we had to choose from a list of "modes of interaction" before we tackled the paper cup, string, and rubber band exercise of stacking three cups. While I wanted to consider the entire task and make a plan, others chose to "get it done quickly", "have fun without focusing on task" or "waiting to see what others wanted to do". Trying to work on a task when eight others were acting out their varied roles made for something like chaos and frustration (for me). Next, in the "Six-word Novel" exercise, our demeanors were totally different: I saw my life rise before me and form into a pattern of six terse words. After the first, I wrote a few more 6-word novels with little effort, even though I had no idea until that 15-minute quiet period with my new-found friends (from the previous exercise). I was surprised that I could pour forth so much inner wisdom and insight about my life-more than I recall coming up with in any

sermon. Sharing it with others in the 9person group was equally rewarding. Getting feedback from others was exhilarating and answering their questions was fun and helpful, reminding me to return the favors to each of them when their turns came. We built a small community because we learned not only about ourselves, we learned about each other. Why can't worship services incorporate some of this level of growth experience? I'm not sure how to carry all this back to my congregation. Can I convey this to folks back home? I can try to use them but cannot be sure of any result. Finally, after our interactions, Dr. Hicks asked for audience response to his question of how it felt to be in a multigenerational group. I rose to say as one in the oldest age group, I felt I was working with my peers because I've been at all the age levels represented in the group. But the younger ones appreared more deferential to my age group, perhaps because they had not yet experienced some of the stages I'd been through. I found other audience comments interesting. Dr. Hicks' comments throughout were extremely helpful.
