Welcome & Approval of Minutes	Jan Fitzgerald introduced us to the MN Valley UU Fellowship. Gina gave a brief description of the Annual Conference Program Committee. The minutes from the October 2009 meeting were approved.				
District UpdateNancy Heege and Sarah Greene	 Ben Stallings, Dick Shelton, and Sarah Greene have spent two months updating the conference web page. The information for the 2010 conference is 30 pages long (formerly 6 pages). There is an index that you can click on to get the information you need. Nancy reported that PSD is working with Central and Heartland Districts doing online workshops. This year, Rev Lisa Presley (Heartland District) and Rev Ian Evision (Central Midwest District) will be attending PSD annual conference. Rev Evision plans the program for the Central Midwest District conference. Rev Presley will be doing a workshop on small congregations. PSD Bylaws specify that the business meeting must be part of the conference. This coupled with the size of the PSD district contribute to making the annual conference more complex than other districts. Most other districts are much simpler with some only one day long. The exception would be the SW district which lasts a week and is held at a resort camp. There is a project sponsored by the UUA to look at GA. Some of the changes being discussed could impact District meetings as well. Nancy will send the committee links which discuss the changes. 				

Program Coordinator Update – Sam Wormley	Sam discussed the different groups that contribute to the Annual Conference including PSD Staff, Awards, Annual Conference Program, Local Arrangements, Site Selection, and Archives Committees. The Annual Conference Program Committee is the most involved and time consuming and works with a different Local Arrangements Committee each year. Duluth LAC contributed money to the Davenport LAC for participation with the Annual Conference Program Committee planning process. This year has seen a tremendous amount of E-mail communication.
2010 Conference Update - Gina Dugan	 Cheryl Wallace will bring the GA chalice to the Annual Conference. We will need a large candle for the chalice. Each year the host GA District may use the chalice. The Annual Conference Program Committee will need to come up with a back-up speaker for Dr. Mark Hicks and his workshop A. Gina suggest that John McCutcheon , if he is willing, be moved to cover workshop A in the event that Mark Hicks could not attend. After some discussion, we will ask Jill Schwendeman from White Bear Lake to be our first backup Judy lecturer and Phil Lund as the second backup. LAC will need to cover lodging for Friday and Saturday nights for Dr. Hicks. Dr. Hicks will be doing a pre-conference workshop and taking part in the LREDA conference. Reimbursement for driving is 50¢ per mile (most likely Dr. Hicks will be driving). The budget approved by the board indicated that \$500 of the \$1,000 speaking fee would come from LREDA and the other half from LAC conference budget. Some members of the LAC and the Annual Conference Committee remember Phil Lund indicating some money from his budget could be used. Nancy will check with Phil Lund. Nancy will open the conference and introduce the Board. LAC will provide an MC. San will introduce the LREDA Team. Laura will introduce Mark Hicks. Barb will work on room arrangements. LREDA will need two projectors for Friday night. This information was passed on to Davenport. Sam will check into getting a projector from Ames. Nancy asked Jan to check copyright issues. LAC will cover hotel rooms for 3 people for 2 nights and no mileage reimbursement. This was OK with Jan.
